RESOLUTION

of the

ORANGE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

regarding

**ESTABLISHING THE CALENDAR YEAR 2003 SPECIAL
ASSESSMENT AT \$146.06 FOR RESIDENTIAL FULL SOLID
WASTE AND RECYCLING COLLECTION, PURSUANT TO
CHAPTER 32 OF THE ORANGE COUNTY CODE**

Resolution No. 2002-M-34

WHEREAS, Section 32-160(k)(1), Orange County Code, addresses full solid waste and recycling collection service (full service) and requires that all persons owning property entitled to full service shall be obligated to pay a charge established by the Board for such full service; and

WHEREAS, Section 32-160(k)(1), Orange County Code, requires that the assessments necessary to fund the program shall be established by resolution of the Board of County Commissioners after public hearing with public notice in the same manner as for County ordinances; and

WHEREAS, a copy of this resolution has been published in the Orlando Sentinel as least fifteen (15) days (excluding Sundays and legal holidays) prior to this September 12, 2002 hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners tentatively set the amount for the residential mandatory solid waste and recycling collection service special assessment for calendar year 2003 at \$146.06.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY

COMMISSIONERS OF ORANGE COUNTY:

Section 1. The calendar year 2003 special assessment for the mandatory residential full service program is hereby established at \$146.06 (the special assessment). Such special assessment is necessary to subsidize the cost of providing solid waste collection and recycling

service to approximately 171,871 residences in 2003 at an annual estimated cost of \$25,103,478.

36 Section 2. The special assessment shall continue to be imposed upon any parcel of land
within unincorporated Orange County on which is located: a mobile home park not exceeding
38 four (4) dwelling units, mobile home subdivisions, single-family residences, and multi-family
residences not exceeding four (4) dwelling units under one common roof. Each dwelling unit in a
40 multi-family residence shall constitute a separate benefit unit.

Section 3. The special assessment shall continue through calendar year 2003 in all
42 respects as described in Orange County Resolution 85-SW-06, as amended, which created the
Municipal Service Taxing Unit and Chapter 32 of the Orange County Code, as amended,
44 providing for the procedure by which solid waste and recycling shall be collected and disposed of
in Orange County. The special assessment shall appear on the property tax bill and shall be
46 collected in the same manner as ad valorem taxes, as authorized by state law.

Section 4. The annual rate of compensation paid to the franchisees providing solid waste
48 collection and recycling services is set as follows:

50	ZONE 1	\$ 69.29 PER RESIDENTIAL UNIT
	ZONE 2	\$ 99.59 PER RESIDENTIAL UNIT
	ZONE 3	\$102.37 PER RESIDENTIAL UNIT
52	ZONE 4	\$ 92.95 PER RESIDENTIAL UNIT
	ZONE 5	\$101.04 PER RESIDENTIAL UNIT

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Section 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

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

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

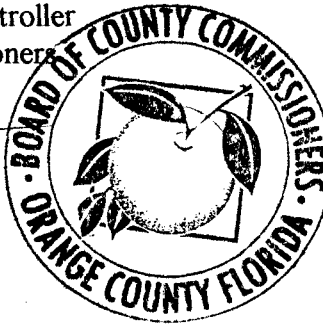
