

## Commissioners Court

Orlando, Orange County Fla

September 3<sup>d</sup> 1870

This being the day appointed for holding a Commissioners Court for the purpose of levying a county tax and for examining the Militia Roll of Orange County

It is ordered by the Board that fifty per cent of the amount of State tax is to be assessed and collected for County purposes

A petition signed by A. Waterman and others asking the removal of the Election Precinct from the Lodge. It is ordered by the Board that the Precinct be removed from the Lodge and that said Precinct be established at Clay Springs in Orange County, and that all public business hereafter transacted at said Precinct at Orange Lodge, hereafter transacted at the said Precinct hereby established at Clay Springs, and that all elections in said District be held at said Precinct at Clay Springs

On Petition of the citizens of Clay Springs and vicinity it is ordered by the Board that this Court on behalf of Orange County accept the right of way through the Lands of Aden Waterman Agent for Quarters, from wharf and warehouse, thirty feet wide, through said lands to where the road forks for the following places viz Mellonville, Orlando, Apopka by the way of Lodge and to Fort Meun. MacMaster & and that Aden Waterman J. M. Auld and Henry Allen are hereby appointed commissioners on said road which is hereby declared by this Board to be a Public Highway

The following named persons were appointed Inspectors of elections at the several precincts of Orange County, at the next Election, to wit:

A. Smith and Absalom Cook.

The Clerk of the Board presented to the court  
the Militia Roll of Orange County, which having  
been examined by the board, and found to  
be correct was returned to the clerk to be  
filed in his office.

It is ordered by the Board that this court  
do now adjourn to meet again on the  
17th day of this month.
