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TOURIST DEVELOPMENT TAX COLLECTIONS ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA

ORLANDO, FLORIDA -- County Comptroller Martha Haynie announced today that tourist tax collections (resort tax) received by the County for the hotel collection month of April 2016 were \$20,707,400. Tourist taxes are charged on short-term rentals, mostly hotels and motels.

Comptroller Haynie indicated that April 2016 collections were nearly 1% lower than April 2015. "While it is useful to track month over month numbers, focusing on a single month is not a reliable way to predict a trend. We are familiar with the "Easter/spring break" effect, which can skew a single month –March or April—in either direction. Certainly, \$20.7 million for the month of April is hardly bad news, and year to date the TDT collections are still almost seven percent ahead of our previous fiscal year. Nevertheless, an occasional slowdown in the growth of the TDT should remind everyone to temper predictions of future revenue growth," stated Haynie.
