TOURIST DEVELOPMENT TAX COLLECTIONS ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA

ORLANDO, FLORIDA -- County Comptroller Martha Haynie announced today that tourist tax

collections (resort tax) received by the County for the hotel collection month of March 2015

were \$24,617,600. Tourist taxes are charged on short-term rentals, mostly hotels and

motels.

Comptroller Haynie indicated that March 2015 collections were nearly 14% higher than March

2014. "I'm excited to announce that this \$24.6 Million revenue represents the largest single

monthly collection of TDT revenues ever received by Orange County. While the timing of the

Easter and spring break holidays can skew March numbers, the fact is we are enjoying a

tremendous benefit for our tourism industry and the whole community. We owe our thanks to

our richly creative hospitality industry, and in no small part to the significant capital

investments they continue to make in Central Florida," stated Haynie.
