





Robert Pittman, Jr. Road Designation

Senate Bill 820, which allows honorary designations of various transportation facilities in specified counties and directs the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to allow and erect suitable markers, was approved by Governor Scott following the 2014 Legislative Session. Section 51 of that bill addresses a portion of State Road 436 that lies in unincorporated Orange County.

State Representative Bryan Nelson, District 31, is requesting the Board adopt a resolution regarding Senate Bill 820 and designating that portion of State Road 436, from Sheeler Avenue to the Seminole County Line, as Robert Pittman, Jr. Road

WHEREAS, Robert G. Pittman, Jr. grew up in Florida, attended the University of Florida and starred in football, baseball and basketball, and later went on to be a successful coach; and

WHEREAS, Robert G. Pittman, Jr. and his family were fixtures in the Apopka region, operating citrus groves and developing a new type of orange variety called the Ponkan Orange; and

WHEREAS, Robert G. Pittman, Jr. played a vital role in Florida’s agriculture industry and its tremendous economic impact to the State of Florida and to the livelihoods of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, Robert G. Pittman, Jr. was a tireless advocate of fairness in taxation for Florida’s farmers; and

WHEREAS, Robert G. Pittman, Jr. was inducted into the Florida Agriculture Hall of Fame in 1982 for his lifetime of contributions to the agriculture industry; and

WHEREAS, Section 51 of Senate Bill 820, enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida in 2014, designated State Road 436 between Sheeler Road and the Seminole County Line in Orange County as “Robert G. Pittman, Jr., Road,” and directed the Florida Department of Transportation to erect suitable markers designating Robert G. Pittman, Jr., Road as such.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY
COMMISSIONERS OF ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and are adopted by reference and incorporated in this Section as if fully set forth in this Section.

Section 2. The Board of County Commissioners hereby affirms its support for Senate Bill 820 designating State Road 436 between Sheeler Avenue and the Seminole County line in Orange County as "Robert G. Pittman, Jr. Road," and for the Florida Department of Transportation to install suitable markers designating such.

Section 3. This Resolution shall take effect upon the date of its adoption.
