# **ACTION REQUESTED:**

Approval to award Invitation for Bids Y15-624-PD, 10,000 Gallon Underground Grease Interceptor Tanks, to the sole responsive and responsible bidder, Highland Tank & Manufacturing Co., in the total contract award amount of \$146,673.84.

# PROCUREMENT:

This contract will provide two 10,000 gallon underground grease interceptor tanks and associated materials to support the Convention Center operations. The tanks will be installed under a separate construction contract that is pending.

# **REMARKS**:
