Orange County Sheriff's Office Request

The Orange County Sheriff's Office is requesting \$6,000 from the FY 2016 Law Enforcement Trust Fund for the following purposes:

**Contributions:**

**National Latino Peace Officers Association (NLPOA) - \$1,000.** Comprised of law enforcement officers from different agencies and citizens from around Central Florida area, NLPOA's mission is to provide the tools to help members become better officers/leaders and build a bridge between law enforcement and citizens of Central Florida. NLPOA sponsors an annual Three Kings Day Celebration that distributes toys to underprivileged children. These children are selected from referrals submitted by school resource officers, children advocate groups, and local ministries. This also gives the children the opportunity to interact with law enforcement officers in a positive manner.

**Victim Service Center of Central Florida, Inc. – \$5,000.** This non-profit organization helps crime victims with transportation to access services and utilize resources, translation services when assisting victims with language barriers, and provides basic emergency needs such as food and shelter.

**ACTION REQUESTED:** Approval for the Orange County Sheriff's Office to spend \$6,000 from the FY 2016 Law Enforcement Trust Fund to provide eligible contributions to National Latino Peace Officers Association, (\$1,000); and Victim Service Center of Central Florida, Inc. (\$5,000).

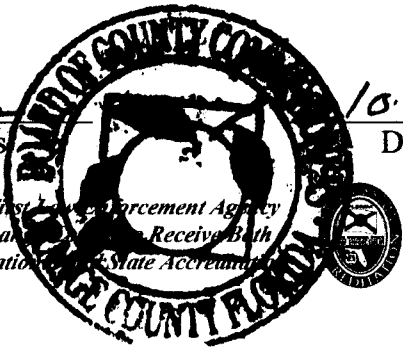
