

## TOURIST DEVELOPMENT TAX COLLECTIONS ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA

ORLANDO, FLORIDA – Orange County Comptroller Phil Diamond announced today that Tourist Development Tax (TDT) collections received by Orange County for the August 2022 TDT collection month were \$23,405,100. That is a 41.1% increase over August 2021.

Month-over-month, August collections were lower than July collections by \$5.1 million. However, they were higher than August 2020 collections by \$17.6 million. In fact, August 2022 collections were the highest August collections on record. The chart below shows monthly TDT collections for the current fiscal year and the previous two fiscal years.




In Millions

On an annual basis, fiscal year-to-date collections totaled \$311.9 million through August marking the highest annual collections ever with one month still remaining in the fiscal year. This shatters the previous record of \$284 million for fiscal year 2018-19. It also surpasses the \$300 million annual collections milestone described below!

August's TDT performance was fueled by steady hotel demand at 1% above 2019 and a strong ADR at \$125.60 vs. \$107.01 in August 2019 (Source: Visit Orlando). On the TDT reserve side, the Renewal and Replacement Reserve increased by \$9.4 million in August as shown in the attached "TDT Cash Reserve Summary".

Collection/Reserve Levels - \$300/300: On August 9<sup>th</sup>, I presented the recommendation to the Board of County Commissioners not to make any new major funding commitments until annual TDT collections reached \$300 million, and \$300 million of reserves were established and maintained. Annual TDT collections have exceeded \$300 million this month! Below is the status of collections and total reserves as of August 31, 2022:



We will release the September TDT collections report in early November.

- 1. Debt service reserves are restricted for debt service only and equal the maximum annual debt service payment.
- 2. The County has committed to maintaining a reserve for property replacement equal to 4% of the Convention Center's gross physical plant and equipment-excluding construction in progress. This Renewal and Replacement Reserve component is currently fully funded at \$63,163,341.

<sup>(1)</sup> The Board of County Commissioners increased the FY 2022 budget by \$50 million on January 25<sup>th</sup>, by another \$50 million on June 21<sup>st</sup>, and then by an additional \$55 million on August 30<sup>th</sup> bringing the total revenue budget to \$330,000,000. The budget is presented on a straight-line basis.
