

## TOURIST DEVELOPMENT TAX COLLECTIONS ORANGE COUNTY, FLORIDA

ORLANDO, FLORIDA – Orange County Comptroller Phil Diamond announced today that Tourist Development Tax (TDT) collections received by Orange County for the April 2023 TDT collection month were \$33,643,600. That is a 3.5% <u>decrease</u> compared to April 2022. This is the first monthly year-over-year decrease since February 2021.

Month-over-month, April collections were lower than March collections by \$5.3 million. However, they were higher than April 2021 collections by \$16.6 million. The chart below shows monthly TDT collections for the current fiscal year and the previous three fiscal years.

Metro Orlando's April hotel performance fell below 2022 in terms of occupancy reaching 77.2% for 2023, compared to 82.8% occupancy for April 2022. The Average Daily Rate outperformed the prior year reaching \$221, a 7% increase from \$207 in April 2022. The leisure hotel segment was the main factor in the year-over-year softening, posting a 5% decline in occupancy from the prior April. Convention hotels averaged a stronger occupancy than their leisure counterparts (80.7% vs. 76.2%) and recorded a slight year-over-year growth (0.4%). The strong performance of the Convention hotel segment during a slower convention center month (OCCC attendance was 38% lower than in April 2022) suggests recovery for the in-house group business. On the TDT reserve side, Renewal & Replacement Reserves increased by \$10.2 million in April as shown in the attached "TDT Cash Reserve Summary".

We will release the May TDT collections report in early July.

- 1. Debt service reserves are restricted for debt service only and equal the maximum annual debt service payment.
- 2. The County has committed to maintaining a reserve for property replacement equal to 4% of the Convention Center's gross physical plant and equipment cost-excluding construction in progress. This Renewal and Replacement Reserve component is currently fully funded at \$63,197,709.
